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INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE
ERASMUS STUDENT NETWORK

GENERAL DISPOSITIONS

Article 1 - Denomination

1.1 The International Erasmus Games, hereafter called IEG, is an international sport event created by Erasmus Student Network Italy and Erasmus Student Network Poland. The current document will be applied to the 4th edition of IEG, which is going to be held in Niš, Serbia from 18th until the 21st of May of 2018.

1.2 *The main objectives of the IEG are:*

1.2.1 Promoting sports and healthy habits, as well as promoting team spirit and cooperation between the communities of students currently abroad with Mobility programmes such as Erasmus+.

1.2.2 Promoting the interaction between the Erasmus Student Network countries that will be participating in the event.

1.2.3 Promoting the main values of the IEG, which are Union, Solidarity and Integration.

Article 2 - Disciplines

2.1 The disciplines are:

2.1.1 Futsal

2.1.2 Basketball

2.1.3 Volleyball

2.1.4 Tennis

2.2. The rules for each of the sports are described in the rulebook.

Article 3 - Delegation Composition

- 3.1 Each country should hold their own preferred format for choosing the participants for the delegation competing in the IEG.
- 3.2 Each delegation from each participating country should have a maximum of 25 participants, including the ESN members.
- 3.3 There should not be more than 6 ESN members in each delegation.
- 3.4 Each delegation has a National Coordinator

Article 4 – Eligibility to participate

- 4.1 Participants are eligible if they are currently studying abroad on a Mobility program or studying abroad as international students or if they are members of an ESN section.

Article 5 - Registrations and Payments

- 5.1 Registration should start 1.5 months prior to the IEG.
- 5.2 Registration has a duration of 1 month.
- 5.3 After registering, the participants should pay the full amount of participation fee in period no longer than 5 days.
- 5.4 The National Coordinator collects the fees for all members of their delegation if possible and then pays all the fees at once as stated by the OC.
- 5.5 Participants who are applying on the last day of registration have one week to make the payment after the OC closes the registration.

Article 6 - Deposits

6.1 The OC can set a deposit depending on the rules of the accommodations

6.2 The deposit is given to the country responsible of each delegation at the end of the IEG.

6.3 The OC and ESN host section are not responsible for damaged objects in the accommodations and at the venues, and as such, the cost will be taken out of the deposit of the participants which are responsible.

6.3.1 If cost of damaged object is more than the deposit, the participant has an obligation to pay the remainder.

6.4 The National Coordinators have a maximum of two weeks after the IEG to give back the deposit to their participants.

Article 7 – Name changes, Withdrawals and Refunds

7.1 Name changes are allowed until a maximum of two weeks prior to the IEG.

7.1.1 If given a valid reason, name changes can be allowed until one week prior to the IEG.

7.1.2 The participants involved in the name change are responsible for settling the payment.

7.2 Withdrawals are permitted until a maximum of one month prior to the IEG.

7.3 Refunds follow the following rules:

7.3.1 Until a maximum of seven days after the payment is done - 100% of the fee is returned except the bank transfer fees.

Article 8 - Participating Countries and Delegates Responsibilities

8.1 Each participating country should send at least one ESN member to serve as a National Coordinator (NC).

8.1.2 Each NC is responsible for the whole delegation.

8.2 Each participating country shall share all communication material requested by the OC on their social media.

8.3 Each NC, until a maximum of three weeks after the IEG shall share a feedback form, provided by the OC, with their participants.

8.4 Each delegation is responsible for purchasing its own trips to the IEG.

Article 9 - Point System

9.1 The IEG will be based upon a point system, and the winners of each discipline and of the whole tournament shall be decided upon whoever earns the most points.

9.2 The point system will be based upon the following rules:

9.2.1 In each discipline, at the beginning of the tournament, each team will begin with 0 points

9.2.2 *There will be several phases to each discipline and points attributed to those who pass each phase, and they include:*

9.2.2.1 Group Phase - Whoever passes gets 1 point

9.2.2.2 Quarter - Finals - Whoever passes gets 2 points

9.2.2.3 Semi - Finals - Whoever passes gets 3 points

9.2.2.4 Finals - Whoever wins get 4 points

9.3 At the end of the event, whichever country has accumulated the most points over all disciplines, wins the IEG.

9.4 *In the case of a tie at the end of the event, the following order of rules will apply to decide the winner of the IEG:*

1. Amount of victories in the finals
2. Amount of Final appearances
3. Average position over all tournaments
